


Growing Responsibility: Our Whole-School Green Action Plan

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My vision for a sustainable school is...



A school where **sustainability** is not just a project or a topic, but a **natural part of school culture**.



Our goal is not only to **build knowledge** but to **shape attitudes** – ones that value nature, community, and thoughtful choices.



The **whole school community** – students, teachers, parents, and staff – **is involved** in a shared learning journey where **everyone's** contribution **matters**.

My vision for a sustainable school is...



Learning happens both **inside** and **outside** the classroom – through growing, experimenting, analyzing, and sharing.



Food is one of our main **focus areas**: **we grow** it ourselves, **value local** and **organic** produce, explore the links between food, **health**, and **climate**, and strive to **reduce food waste**.

Every age group has **meaningful ways to contribute** and **learn**.

My Green Action Plan, formulated SMART:

Specific

- To make sustainable food habits a natural part of school culture.
- We focus on reducing food waste, valuing local and organic food, and raising awareness about thoughtful eating habits.

Measurable

- Monitor food waste weekly in the canteen, aiming for at least a 20% reduction in the first year.
- Compare baseline with results every 6 months
- Collect feedback from students, teachers, kitchen staff
- Track participation and visible change across age groups

My Green Action Plan, formulated SMART:

Achievable

- The whole school is involved – students aged 7–18, teachers, kitchen staff, and parents.
- Activities are integrated into lessons, projects, and everyday school life.

Realistic

- The topic is practical, relatable, and supports value-based education.
- We aim to shape attitudes that promote care for nature, food, and shared responsibility.

Time-bound

- The action plan runs from **September 2025 to June 2027**.
- Progress will be reviewed every 6 months, with final presentations and reflection in spring 2027.
